Audition Piece 1

(There are two sections to this audition, please prepare BOTH parts. Part 1 is after the opening number; Lazy Susan brings on a small heater and stands in front of it.)

Susan Hello everybody! I said hello everybody! My name's Susan, what's your name? Hang on, let's do this one at a time, we'll start with you on the end and move along. No, that might take a while. Anyway what did I come out here for? Oh I know; where is it? (Looks round.) Has anyone seen my heater? I'm sure I had it when I came on. It's where? Behind me? (Ad lib.) Oh yes so it is. It was there all along, silly me.

Now, as I said my name's Susan and do you know what boys and girls? People round here call me Lazy Susan! And I am not lazy, I'm a very energetic person trapped in the body of someone who wants to sleep. Talking of which, I always fall asleep when I shouldn't and it's getting me in trouble. Will you help me stay awake? Will ya? Alright, every time you see me getting tired, I want you all to shout "Wake Up Susan". Will ya do it? OK remember, every time I start to yawn... *(Stretches and yawns, reaction.)* Did you do it? Sorry; I didn't hear you, I was asleep y'see? Let's try again. *(They do.)* That was better, but you have to do it really really loud, I could be asleep right over... *(Yawns.)* Ah that's much better thanks, look after me like that and we'll be fine.

Now what was I doing? (Sees heater.) Oh yeah. Now, does anyone know where I can plug this in? You see, they told me I had to come on and warm up the audience. You'd think on our budget we could have got a bigger one for you. Perhaps if we all huddle up...

Lazy Susan Audition Piece 2

(In Part 2, Susan has a wager with the Captain. You may ad-lib whatever you'd like to do to attract the dog's attention!)

Susan	Don't you get bored on these long sea journeys?
Captain	Oh I don't mind, I've got my pet dog for company.
Susan	A dog? I never knew you had a dog!
Captain	Aye, the ship's mascot, Salty. I've had him since he was a puppy, I ship trained him and everything.
Susan	Aw I love dogs, can I see him?
Captain	Oh no. He's dead vicious with strangers. And seeing as I trained him, he only obeys orders from me.
Susan	Oh go on, I'm sure he'll like me – and I'm really good with dogs. I bet I'll have him eating out of my hand.





Captain Eating your hand, more like. But if you do fancy a bet and you reckon you're so good with dogs, I'll bet you five pounds you can't get him to do anything for you.

Susan Alright then, you're on...

- **Captain** (*Fetching the dog,*) Ok but I'm telling you, he only obeys my commands.
- **Susan** Great! I've got a way with dogs, they love me. This'll be the easiest fiver I've ever earned.

(Captain returns with a stuffed toy dog.)

Captain	There you are
Susan	What's that?
Captain	That's Salty, my pet dog.
Susan	But but that's not a dog, it's a toy!
Captain	Don't let him hear you say that! Last time someone said that to him, he bit their leg clean off! How d'ya think Peg Leg Pete got his name?
Susan	Yeah but, you can't expect me to teach that to do tricks can you?
Captain	Oh if you can't, you can just hand over the five pounds you owe me
Susan	What? Well, if I've lost anyway, I might as well have a go. Put him down then. (<i>Captain does. Susan frantically tries unsuccessfully to attract the dog's attention. Ad lib.</i>) Oh this is ridiculous; I give up.
Captain	Very well, five pounds please
Susan	Oh alright. <i>(Just about to pay.)</i> Just a minute though, you reckon you've trained him to obey your commands, right?
Captain	Right.
Susan	Prove it. Prove that Salty does everything you say and I'll give you the five pounds.
Captain	Alright then. (Captain picks up dog, crosses stage and puts him down. Backs away and crouches.) Salty Salty stay! (Pause. Turns to Susan and opens hand.)
Susan	Fair enough. (Gives him money.)
